Marine/Coastal :

South Coast Marine Recovery Project. Devon Wildlife Trust has done a bid for an ambitious new community-led initiative that Devon Wildlife Trust is helping to shape alongside the Wildlife Trusts in Cornwall, Dorset, Hampshire & Isle of Wight, and Sussex. Coastwise North Devon has done intertidal surveys for the **Wildlife Trust Shoresearch project** at Westward Ho! Combesgate Woolacombe and Hele Bay. Surveys have also been done at Cheyne Beach. The winter storms have moved quite a bit of sand and pebbles around. INNShore invasives surveys have been replaced by the Timed Species Shoresearch survey which also looks at invasives and new arrivals /departures from the shore. The first survey was completed at Lee Bay, Ilfracombe with a second one at Westward Ho!. Dates are advertised on the DWT Website Events section.

Is the animal alive? Please call **British Divers Marine Life Rescue** immediately on 01825 765546 (office hours) or 07787 433412 (out of hours). Keep your distance, and keep other people and dogs away.

If the animal is dead, please call **Devon Marine Strandings Network** on 07719 086531 or email strandings@devonwildlifetrust.org. Please include photos, a location and when you found it. Save the numbers in your phone and spread the word by [downloading our leaflet](#). “

Dead birds can be reported to the Devon Marine Strandings Network. If still alive the advice is to phone the RSPCA West Hatch Wildlife Centre 0300 1230721 and not to touch dead or living birds due to the risk of avian influenza. Sightings of possible avian influenza cases should also be reported to DEFRA 03459 335577.

Land advice to landowners: Advice is continuing to be available to landowners and farmers in the area through the **Working Wetlands Project, Northern Devon Natural Solutions and Saving Devon's Treescapes**. To find out more: www.devonwildlifetrust.org/working-landowners-and-farmers

[Working Wetlands & Upstream Thinking | Devon Wildlife Trust](#). Their wildflower nursery is now able to grow more than 20000 plants a year for use by local landowners. In partnership with the Woodland Trust 30000 free trees were provided via this project and Northern Devon Natural Solutions . Part of the aim is to slow the movement of water through landscapes and improve water quality by reducing amounts of soil and other nutrients entering ditches , streams and rivers from farmlands

[Northern Devon Natural Solutions | Devon Wildlife Trust](#). The North Devon Natural Solutions team have reported that volunteers from the Torridge Rivers Association area have been reintroducing salmon to the River Torridge . Another project example has been working with a landowner on the River Torridge to gain support through a Countryside Higher Tier agreement. This included working with ELMS (Environmental Land Management Schemes) with work focussing on holding water in the landscape, providing multiple wildlife habitats and delivering “ Natural Flood Management” through floodplain reconnection

Wilder Communities

This project is working in the North Devon area to engage with and support communities on a wide range of projects with advice on funding too. There is a Wilder Community award available to groups [Wilder Communities | Devon Wildlife Trust](#).

Sites for Nature : The DWT looks at a range of different designated sites and we have a number in the Taw Torridge Estuary area : Special Areas of Conservation (SACs) and Special Protected Areas (SPAs) These are the top area of designation and protection ; Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSIs) these are the next tier of designation ; County Wildlife Sites (CWS) These are recognised for their county-level importance to Wildlife but don't carry the same level of statutory protections as the others above. There are other designations eg UNESCO Biosphere . DWT in partnership with Devon Biodiversity Records centre and the Devon County Council are hoping to survey as many as possible of the **Unconfirmed Wildlife Sites** (UWS) which are waiting to find if they qualify as County Wildlife Sites. Beaver Project

DEFRA announced in 2025 that Beavers can be allowed to live wild in England. DWT is managing and supporting projects. Populations already on the river Taw will be allowed to remain and expand naturally. Future beaver reintroductions will need to be managed under a licence system run by Natural England.
